

Clarinda Veterans Scholarship

The Clarinda Veterans Scholarship Fund was established by a group of local veterans to provide tuition aid for the post-secondary education of a Clarinda or South Page graduating senior that plans to enroll at an accredited technical/vocational school or college and is a descendent (sibling, child, grandchild or great-grandchild) of a U.S. veteran with special consideration based on need, scholarly achievement, character and reputation.

The following guidelines will be used in making the scholarship selection:

- 1. The scholarship must be used to help pay the cost of any technical/vocational school, college or university.
- 2. The applicant must be a descendent (sibling, child, grandchild or great-grandchild) of a U.S. Veteran and shall provide such verification by including a copy of the veteran's DD214 with the application. If you need assistance in obtaining a copy of the DD214 you may contact your school counselor and they can provide you information as to how to obtain a copy.
- 3. The Clarinda Foundation shall disburse the scholarship grant to a technical/vocational school, college or university indicated by the recipient in one payment prior to the beginning of the fall semester of year in which the scholarship is awarded.
- 4. The scholarship Selection Committee shall be a minimum of four representatives: 1) one named by the Clarinda Foundation (who shall serve as chair of the Committee); 2) the Clarinda Community High School Principal; 3) Clarinda Community Guidance Counselor; and 4) and a minimum of one representative of the Clarinda Veterans Scholarship Fund. Should there be an applicant from the South Page School District then a minimum of one South Page Faculty shall serve on the Committee.
- 5. The selection committee reserves the right to not award the scholarship should they determine that no applicant is worthy.
- 6. The application must be typed or computer generated and shall include an essay addressing the following:
 - a. College the graduate plans to attend or those that they are considering.
 - b. The intended major of the graduate and why they have chosen this as their major.
 - c. The graduate's contributions to their high school and the community.
 - d. Any work history the graduate may have.
 - e. The graduate's extracurricular activities.
 - f. Explain who the U.S. Veteran was and how they are related to you. Also, include any information you may have in regard to their time served in the military.
- 7. The scholarship shall be awarded without regard to race, color, creed, gender, nationality, origin or physical handicap.
