reading buddies, summer offerings, public library collaboration, science/social studies opportunities, collaboration with preschools, continued professional development for teachers, HS Volunteers, parent learning and engagement, reading mentoring program, interest-based/challenging learning environments, application of skills, after school programs, advocacy for preschool (full state funding), access to books and resources for kids and teachers, engagement on advisory boards, reading bedtime stories for students, and reading stamina support.
